as we execute the VCT's investment strategy. The VCT team, which recently expanded to four with

the appointment of a Legal Counsel, remains within the larger Hargreave Hale fund management

team and benefits from the substantial knowledge and experience within it. Giles Hargreave's expertise in UK small-cap is widely recognised and we are pleased that he will continue to support

the VCT Team as we invest in some of the UK's most exciting and innovative small businesses."
